As a certified vascular centre with more than 3,000 surgical and in excess of 4,000 nonsurgical procedures for vascular diseases, the Clinic for Vascular Surgery is one of the largest specialist facilities for vascular disorders in Germany. St. Josef Hospital has 35 beds available for the treatment of inpatients. The clinic specialises in the treatment of aneurysms (open surgery/endovascular), the treatment of carotid stenoses and the minimally invasive treatment of vascular occlusions and thromboses, in addition to providing a special outpatient service for dialysis access. Affiliated to the clinic is the interdisciplinary Vein Centre, the first certified vein centre of excellence at a university clinic in Germany. Among the key prerequisites for this role are a junior professorship with a positive evaluation, a post-doctoral lecturing qualification or equivalent academic achievements as well as proof of special aptitude for academic teaching and a commitment to participating in academic self-administration. The successful candidate will be expected to integrate into the Faculty's principal

research areas (oncology, neurosciences, and protein sciences). Ideally, this will be complemented by clinical-scientific collaborative efforts with institutions of the Faculty of Medicine and the UK-RUB in the current focal areas of research and development as well as participation in existing and future collaborative research projects.

The appointment procedures will be conducted by Ruhr-Universität Bochum in agreement with Katholisches Klinikum Bochum as the body responsible for St. Josef-Hospital. Employment will be on the basis of an employment contract under private law. Affiliation with the University shall be governed by the provisions set out in Section 9 (2) HG NRW.
