Medical Clinic V has 72 beds (including 7 beds in the palliative care unit) and treats more than 4,000 inpatients and 15,000 outpatients every year. The clinical spectrum covers every aspect of medical oncology and hematology (with the exception of stem cell transplants), the focus being on tumors of the digestive organs and thoracic oncology. Since 2024, the Clinic has been part of the certified Lung Cancer Center in Hemer, one of the largest facilities for lung tumors in Germany, which in turn has been affiliated with the RUB Oncology Center (RUCCC) since 2021.
